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

Vanda (Syn. Neofinetia) falcata

One of my favourite orchids (Could anyone possibly have just one favourite orchid?) is the miniature growing Vanda falcata. This elegant, cool-growing orchid hails from the cooler areas of China, Korea and Japan where it has a very long history of cultivation. Its name in Japanese is fu-ran meaning 'wind orchid'. As the name suggests, these orchid like plenty of air movement, especially around the roots which, as you can see from the photos, like to roam free of the container. In its natural habitat *V. falcata* grows on rocks or deciduous trees where it gets full winter sun but shade in summer.

V. falcata has the typical monopodial stem and fan shaped leaves of vandaceous orchids and I find it readily develops into clumps with multiple growths. The delicate flowers have a long spur like the African angraecums and the orchid was mistakenly included in that group when it flowered in England in the early 1800s. The flowers are pure white and have a lovely fragrance, particularly at night, designed to attract its nocturnal pollinator. There is supposed to be a pink

form which I covet but the two that I have bought that were labelled

'pink' both turned out to be pristine white. Grrr!

The other common name for this orchid is the 'Samurai Orchid' as apparently once it was only allowed to be owned by aristocratic Samurai families as a symbol of their nobility and wealth. In Japan it is cultivated atop a mound of sphagnum moss and sometimes the plant is prized more for its variegated leaves that the flowers themselves. (The picture at the right is from the internet.) I tried this method with the plant at the top but over time it has become a jungle and I'm not sure how I'm going to tackle it. I also grow it in a clear pot (below) in a mix of bark, perlite and some chopped up sphagnum moss.



V. falcata usually flowers in the summer but I find it often flowers more than once a year. It needs a winter rest when fertiliser is withheld and watering is reduced. It has been used extensively in intergeneric hybrids and Ascofinetia Cherry Blossom (Ascocentrum ampullaceum x Neofineta falcata) is often available from orchid vendors. This compact little gem rarely exceeds 120mm and tolerates a wide range of conditions and I think it is well worth a place in every orchid collection.
