WELCOME by PRESIDENT

President Louise Gannon opened the meeting, and welcomed all members and visitors.
Brian Phelan was thanked for taking the Novice Corner for tonight.

ACCEPTANCE of the MINUTES

Minutes of the March General Meeting were accepted as read. Moved: Robin Gunter, seconded Diane Slye.

Minutes of the Extraordinary General Meeting held on Monday 29 April 2019 were accepted as read. Moved John Clancy, seconded Lynne Phelan.

BUSINESS ARISING: (from the previous minutes) - nil

CORRESPONDENCE: (Secretary's report) Moved Francoise Sikora, seconded Diane Slye that the correspondence be accepted as read.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Moved Francoise Sikora, seconded Valerie Starling that the report presented by Treasurer Tom Gablonski be accepted. Tom advised that he has investigated the cost of printed receipt books and has also purchased a personalized stamp for the Society – costs for stamp and envelopes (\$71.30) to be reimbursed. The purchase of the printed receipt books to be discussed at committee.

COMMITTEE REPORT

President Louise Gannon reported on the first meeting of the new Committee which was held earlier this month. It went for three long hours with a lot discussed. One of our main concerns is the amount of expenditure that has taken place of the last year up to the AGM in February. We are spending more than what we are getting in income.

One item that was included in this was for Show Rosettes and Ribbons. The amount which covered this year's Shows and some place ribbons for next year came to \$984. The money has already been paid but the ribbon company has accepted a new order from our Society which has changed the rosettes to sashes and altered the quantity of place ribbons. The new cost is less than half of the \$984. Our Society will endeavour to have the balance returned or more than likely have a credit for next year.

Our Committee is committed to reigning in our spending.

GENERAL BUSINESS

The dates previously mentioned for Bunnings BBQs are apparently non-existent. We have phoned and been down to Bunnings and they say no dates are allocated past the end of June. We must apply for the dates we would like but no guarantees. We will keep following this up.

Thanks were extended to Mick Bodycott for the time he spent on our previous Committee Mick was a valued member of our Committee and always contributed with considered opinions. Mick has started his own business and cannot attend Committee Meetings but hopefully we will see him, his wife and young family at future general meetings.

Benching of our Orchids on meeting night is still the same with members still voting for the orchids that they like in the different classes, resulting in the Popular Vote.

The Plant of the Night is now divided into two classes: Plant of the Night – Species, and Plant of the Night – Hybrid. This will be judged by a senior member.

The Growing Competition has changed from tonight, with all plants being judged together. A first and second place will be given.

When allocating future Growing Plant seedlings we will continue to give Novice members the more advanced seedlings and then intermediate and then Open members.

The Committee has decided not to give certificates each month, no laminated photos etc. Instead benching results and photos will be in the Newsletter and points accumulated until the end of the year for Presentation Night.

We want to get back to talking about how we grow our orchids, and the ways to grow them better.

Our raffle plants tonight are not small seedlings, but established plants and can be easily grown in a shade house. We will try to continue to source similar reasonably sized plants and our Society would appreciate any donations of quality plants from Open members. Please contact the President or a Committee Member.

Thanks were extended to Lynne for getting the new benching system up and running and also to Eti, Suzanne and Lynne for collating information for the Newsletter.

Thanks were extended to Francoise for volunteering to help the Novice and New Members, and to Ron and Phil for looking after the Sales Table.



LYNNE"S HINTS FOR STAGING YOUR ORCHID

Staging is another name for benching your orchid. It's about giving your plant its best chance in the judging process and also helping to make the benching marshal's job as easy as possible.

- Your plant needs to be self-supporting when it is benched and it needs to be able to be moved by the benching marshal. That is, you can't bring your orchid in, put it on the bench and then arrange some prop to hold the flower spike up which will fall down if the plant is moved.
- Pendulous plants need to be raised so their racemes are above the bench use an upturned pot, stand, etc. Make sure the combination of orchid and support are stable and moveable.
- Top heavy plants can be made stable by double potting into a larger pot, packing in the space between with damp newspaper. Brian has a stack of these already made up as he grows most of his plants in tiny pots in trays and they rarely stand up by themselves.
- You can also make a pot holder out of a larger pot if the plant is unstable. Cut a circle out of the bottom out of the larger pot so the rim of the smaller one fits inside but doesn't fall through the upturned holder pot. (See photo)
- Small orchids often benefit from being raised so the judges can see them better. VERY small orchid flowers may need a magnifying glass so the visiting members of the public can appreciate them!
- Brian grows a lot of his plants hooked onto wire mesh along the walls of the glasshouse. These can be similarly displayed on the bench using a simple homemade stand which has a vertical piece of timber through which two holes have been drilled about 4mm apart and a cable tie firmly looped through. The twin hook pot holder will hook through the tie allowing the plant to hang as it has been growing.
- (I think) Species should be presented how they grow so if it has a natural arching spike it shouldn't be staked straight up. (That's my opinion though I don't think it's a judging rule.) I have seen species cymbidiums staked upright but I think they look much

better if they are allowed to gracefully arch as they do naturally.

• You can use decorative pots but use a pot that doesn't overwhelm the orchid. The orchid should catch the judge's eyes, not the pot.
